

THEORY OF CHANGE

CURRENT OPERATING CONTEXT

We operate in a region of extremes. Chronic unaffordability is a key distinguishing factor with a growing divide between very wealthy people and those who are living in poverty. Key social issues include housing affordability, social isolation, loneliness, domestic and family violence. Population health challenges include obesity, mental health, dementia and addiction. Our region aligns with the Metro Sydney Aboriginal Land Council and the La Perouse Aboriginal Land Council boundaries, which are serviced by two major local health districts, one primary health network and 400+ not-for-profit, health and social care organisations. We have a highly diverse population including significant ATSI, CALD, ageing, LGBTQI+, young persons and disability communities.
